West Gallery Revisited, Vic Gammon, Conservative Function Room, 11.30 Friday

Having thought I had left research on what we call West Gallery Music long behind me, I was asked by the irrepressible Steve Roud to contribute an article on the subject to *the Routledge Companion to English Folk Performance* which was published last year. In this presentation I will give a brief overview of my chapter in the book. I first studied English 'parochial psalmody' in the 1970s and have occasionally written on it since then. Writing this chapter gave me the opportunity to consider new research, popular misconceptions and previous criticisms of my work. I will consider questions of definition, who the musicians were, their repertory, instrumentation and performance style, the critics of the music and performers and its elimination from the church. Finally, I will consider the survivals and revivals of this music. I will make a chronology available. Sheila Gammon will join me to read some of the fascinating source material on which the chapter is based.
